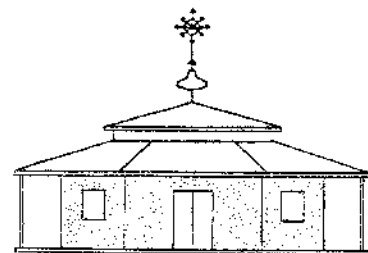

SAVE OUR SQUARE COMMITTEE

Following the Public Meeting held on 12th Oct. at which the Community decided not to support the new development proposal for the Shopping Centre by a margin of 4 to 1, the SOS Committee submitted the Community's objection to the proposed development to Fingal County Council. The Objection referred to several issues on which the Community has expressed their view including the height, traffic, overlooking, light and security, etc. There were several other

Objections , including one from the Community Centre and from individual residents. There was also a supporting observation submitted.

On 2nd Dec Fingal County Council referred the proposal back to the Applicant seeking Additional Information (A1). A total of 22 pieces of A1 were sought. The main concerns raised by the SOS Committee, by the Community Centre and by residents were all included in the A1 request. In particular, the Applicant was asked to show why the height should not be set at 3 storeys on the Southern and Western elevations, at 4 storeys for the rest of the building, and with a reduction in the number of apartments to achieve that outcome.
