MOTHER TERESA—CHAMPION OF THE POOR

In our time, Mother Teresa was an outstandingly charismatic person. She knew that she had been richly gifted by God, not for her own delight or self promotion, but for the glory of God. She knew that these gifts had been given to her freely so that she, in turn, should place them totally at the service of the whole community. She was well aware that with the gift comes responsibility to zealously work with one's talents for the up-building of the Kingdom. That explains her determination to carry out immediately whatever Jesus asked of her.

On September 4th September, Pope Francis will solemnly Proclaim that, during her long life of heroic virtue she lived in outstanding faithfulness to God's grace. By declaring her a saint, the Church offers Saint Teresa to all of us, as a model to give us hope and as an intercessor to pleas, on our behalf, before God.

Her canonisation brings great joy to millions around the world. First and foremost the 5,000 plus Missionaries of Charity— Sisters, Brother, Priests and co-workers in their 700 convents will rejoice wholeheartedly. Their dearest Mother will, hence Forth, be officially numbered among the ranks of the saints. Religious men and women will feel happy and honoured and, in particular, the Loreto Sisters in Ireland whom she joined in Dublin in 1928 and by whom she was sent to India.
