
We encourage all those at home to pray as set out below –

Reflection on Today's Gospel

John the Evangelist describes the call of the first disciples, where Jesus asks the searching question addressed to every reader of the **Gospel**: ‘*What do you want?*’ Here begins the journey of getting to know Jesus, as the disciples (and we ourselves) follow on the path of an understanding of who Jesus Christ is.

This week, we, too, may ask for the grace of an *open ear* and an open-hearted response to Jesus’ invitation to ‘*Come and see*’. We also remember those who, as yet have ‘*no knowledge of the Lord*’, and ask that they may come to know the safety and peace such knowledge can bring in an uncertain world.

Pope Francis on New Year's Day

This year, while we hope for new beginnings and new cures, let us not neglect care. Together with a vaccine for our bodies, we need a vaccine for our hearts. That vaccine is care. Let us ask for the grace to find time for God and for our neighbour – for those who are alone or suffering, for those who need someone to listen and show concern for them. If we can find time to give, we will be amazed and filled with joy, like the shepherds. We too are called to bless, to “speak well” in God’s name. Our world is gravely polluted by the way we “speak” and think “badly” of others, of society, of ourselves. Speaking badly corrupts and decays, whereas blessing restores life and gives the strength needed to begin anew each day. Let us ask the Mother of God for the grace to be joyful bearers of God’s blessing to others, as she is to us.

Christian Unity Week January 18th – 25th

Theme

The theme for the 2021 Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is 'Abide in my Love...You Shall Bear Much Fruit'. It was discerned by the Monastic Community of Grandchamp in Switzerland and finds its origins in the Gospel of John (John 15:5-9).

Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2021

18th to 25th January marks the Octave of Prayer for Christian Unity. This year's Liturgy was prepared by the monastic community of sisters in Grandchamp, Switzerland, who draw much from the spirit of the Taizé Community. This year's Inaugural Service, hosted by Christ Church Rathgar Presbyterian and organised by the Dublin Council of Churches, will be available as a pre-recorded You Tube featuring participants from 14 Christian denominations in the Dublin area. Archbishop Diarmuid Martin is the preacher.

Application is for a new Mains Gas Development (Under & Over Ground), beside 'An Post' Letterbox. It appears to be Emergency Venting of Mains Pipeline Gas into the atmosphere. No pre-app. meetings by Applicant or FCC with householders has taken place. No EPA, EIS, Health & Safety, Insurance Indemnity or Safety Certs. are present.

It is in close proximity to residential zoned houses and on the Amenity Green. FCC agreed to provide applicant with required Lands. We recommend that you contact your local Howth/Malahide Cllrs (7) and T.D.s' (5) on the issue urgently. Closing date for FCC Planning Application Observations Submission is active unless, with major Govt. Pandemic Restrictions, they can have it withdrawn. Thank You.
