Reflection on Today's Gospel

'Take nothing for the journey except a staff'

It has always been God's plan to choose ordinary people like us to help spread the Good News. Jesus asks us to listen, and really come to know him and trust him, and we will be blessed with all we need to follow his way.

Amos, a shepherd, has simply listened and responded with courage and faith to God's call. He has spoken up for the poor of Bethel. **(First reading)**

Paul's letter to the Ephesians begins with a prayer of praise and blessing to God. We have always been part of God's plan: **'Before the world was made, God chose us.'**

Through the gifts of Christ and our faith, we are God's loved and forgiven sons and daughters. **(Second Reading)**

In the **Gospel**, Jesus sends out the apostles in pairs to support one another, teaching others the message of love and repentance they have seen and learnt from him. They are to carry nothing other than a staff, but to trust in God's love and rely on the hospitality of others.

Let's pray that we show Jesus' message in our love for those we meet each day and to be witnesses to the joy of our faith in the way in which we live our lives.

Dear Parishioners

We would be grateful if you could return the recently posted tax claim forms to the parish office. This scheme allows to parish to claim back tax on contributions of €250 or over in one year for each eligible parishioner. It is a vital income we rely on to maintain our Church in regard to lighting, heating, salaries, repairs, supplies and general day to day expenses. This scheme in no way affects you own tax, it is independent. It also now allows the parish to claim for those who are self employed. It applies to all who are paying tax (small or large), retired or working. We are very grateful to all who have joined up and continue to do so. If you do not wish to be involved, please inform the parish office and we will take you of the list.
