### Reflection on Today's Gospel

*His hands were as earth beneath the bread and his voice was as thunder above it' St Ephrem the Syrian (d. 373)*

This Sunday's readings remind us that God provides for us physically as well as spiritually.

St Paul, (**Second Reading**), assures the Christian community that God, who unifies the people, is in control. The three readings are brought together in the **Gospel** account of the Feeding of the Five Thousand (which is a foreshadowing of the Eucharist and the only miracle of Jesus that is recounted in all four gospels). Jesus demonstrates that, by feeding the people from his own divine hands, God is unifying the people through meeting their needs.

Let's pray, this week, that we might know that we are in the hands of the Lord, and that our lives may bear abundant fruit as a result.

### Pope Francis

Pope Francis has advised people to switch off from the stresses of modern life.

During his weekly Sunday noon address at St. Peter's Square, he encouraged the hundreds of people in the audience to regularly turn off their mobile phones so that they can "truly rest".

It was his first public appearance since returning to the Vatican last week after an 11-day stay in hospital, where the 84-year-old had [surgery to remove part of his colon](#). When recovering in Rome's private Gemelli Polytechnic hospital, he had addressed crowds from the balcony of his 10th-floor room. He had lauded the "precious benefit" of universal free healthcare. In his most recent address, Pope Francis did not mention his recovery from surgery but stressed the value of "rest, contemplation and compassion."

## World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly

- Pope Francis has established a World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly – starting today, Sunday, 25<sup>th</sup> July – theme ‘I am with you always’ (Mt 28:20).

This is an excerpt of his message –

*Dear Elderly Friends,*

“I am with you always” (Mt 28:20): this is the promise the Lord made to his disciples before he ascended into heaven. They are the words that he repeats to you today, dear grandfathers and grandmothers, dear elderly friends. “I am with you always” are also the words that I, as Bishop of Rome and an elderly person like yourselves, would like to address to you on this first World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly. The whole Church is close to you – to us – and cares about you, loves you and does not want to leave you alone!

I am well aware that this Message comes to you at a difficult time: the pandemic swept down on us like an unexpected and furious storm; it has been a time of trial for everyone, but especially for us elderly persons. Many of us fell ill, others died or experienced the death of spouses or loved ones, while others found themselves isolated and alone for long periods.

The Lord is aware of all that we have been through in this time. He is close to those who felt isolated and alone. Even at the darkest moments, as in the months of pandemic, the Lord continues to send *angels* to console our loneliness and to remind us: “I am with you always”. He says this to you, and he says it to me. That is the meaning of this Day, which I wanted to celebrate for the first time in this particular year, as a long period of isolation ends and social life slowly resumes. May every grandfather, every grandmother, every older person, especially those among us who are most alone, receive the visit of an *angel*!
